## Formation of Comunn na Feinne Pipe Band

At the Comunn na Feinne meeting held 7<sup>th</sup> March, 1907, reference was made to the formation of a Comunn na Feinne Pipe Band. The Society had previously "approved" of this and it was reported that, "good progress had already been made in that direction."

On the 10<sup>th</sup> July 1907, it was reported that 14 pupils of the newly formed Pipe Band, "were making good progress under the tuition of Pipe Major Hugh Fraser, of Melbourne." On 23<sup>rd</sup> July, 1908 it was further announced that the young pipers "were enthusiastic and eager to make themselves proficient, and will be of great service to Comunn na Feinne on the occasion of the annual demonstration and entertainment. A Pipe Band was a long felt want by the Society for many years, and now it is practically an accomplished fact." Hearing that the Band required six sets of Pipes to fully equip the Band, the President Phillip Russell, "generously donated £20, the price of two sets. This is one of the interests Phillip Russell takes in Comunn na Feinne." It was also reported that a "generous gift" from another Scot towards the purchase of the remaining four sets, was greatly appreciated.

It was announced that the Pipe Band, consisting of ten pipers and three drummers, "headed by Drum Major Colin Reid, and Pipe Major Donald William MacDonald, made their first public appearance."

On the visit of the Governor of Victoria, Sir Thomas Gibson Carmichael, and Lady Carmichael, to Geelong on 17<sup>th</sup> December, 1908, the Comunn na Feinne Pipe Band played a welcome to the official party.

A letter, dated Macedon 18<sup>th</sup> December, 1908, from the Hon. Victor Hood, private secretary to the State Governor, was received by James Galbraith, the Society's secretary. It read:

"Dear Sir, Will you please take the opportunity of expressing to the Pipers the appreciation of his Excellency, the Governor Sir Thomas Gibson Carmichael, and Lady Carmichael, of their kindly attendance and welcome accorded by them, which added considerably to the pleasure of their visit to Geelong."

## Appendix 13 (b) 'The Australian Ladies Pipe Band'

The Band's record while overseas was an outstanding one. It was met at Glasgow Railway Station by a crowd of 42,000 people. It was the first Ladies' Pipe Band to enter the famous Cowal Games at Dunoon and at the Braemar Gathering in the presence of the King and Queen. But it did more than just get into the record books on the account of being an all-ladies' pipe band. "It won the Murray Trophy, the Cowal Gold Medal and nine individual silver medals" at the Cowal Games. In addition, Miss Gertie Oliver, who had connections to Geelong, "won the title as champion female Highland dancer of Scotland." (Julie Church, 'Ladies and Bagpipes', *Memento* Issue 36, pp10-12, National Archives of Australia, Canberra)

Miss Gertie Oliver, one of the pipers and dancers, had much personal success abroad. In Scotland, she played before Sir Harry Lauder and his wife ... In Jersey she played before His Excellency, the Lieutenant Governor of Jersey. Mr Morrison, a personal friend of His Excellency, was present at the time and so admired her playing and dancing that he presented her with a clock."
